# MEKONG – ROK COOPERATION FUND (MKCF)

## Announcement of the 10th Call for MKCF Regional Project Proposals

---

### Introduction

The Mekong–Republic of Korea (ROK) partnership was launched in 2011, leading to the establishment of the Mekong–ROK Cooperation Fund (MKCF) in 2013. The MKCF supports cooperative projects led by the Mekong countries and the ROK under the Mekong–ROK cooperation framework.

The Fund promotes collaboration in seven priority sectors, as outlined in the Mekong–Han River Declaration for Establishing a Partnership for People, Prosperity, and Peace, adopted during the 1st Mekong–ROK Summit in 2019.

The fund provides grants for projects with a regional focus—benefiting multiple Mekong countries (Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Viet Nam, and Thailand)—while aligning with national priorities to foster regional integration. Projects may be implemented in a single country, but their outcomes should benefit the broader Mekong region as well as the ROK.

### Funding Criteria

MKCF supports catalytic and innovative projects in the following seven priority sectors. *The EoI must indicate the Sector and the sub sector.*

**(7) Non-traditional Security Challenges**

- Facilitation of safe labor migration within the Mekong region
- Disaster management for natural hazards Clearance of explosive remnants of war, illegal drug trafficking, human trafficking
- Prevention of security areas to address transnational crime, terrorism and violent extremism
- Cyber security to build an open and secure cyber space
- Safe Mekong, combating Illicit Trafficking, surveillance techniques and transboundary coordination etc.

## Eligibility Requirements

Entities eligible to apply for the MKCF include:

- Government agencies and autonomous organizations from Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Vietnam, and Thailand (CLMVT), as well as the Republic of Korea (ROK).
- Non-governmental organizations (NGOs), academic institutions, and training institutes from CLMVT and the ROK.
- International organizations, including UN agencies and international NGOs with offices in the Mekong countries and the ROK.
- Organizations with at least five years of experience in implementing development projects.

**Note:** *The MKCF does not provide funding or assistance to individuals.*

## Budget and Project Duration

- MKCF provides grants ranging from \$300,000 to \$1,000,000 per project.
  - The Fund encourages triangular (three-way) or quadripartite (four-way) collaborations with other donors, such as the Mekong River Commission (MRC), Japan, the United States, Australia, New Zealand, Germany, and Canada. Additional funding sources should be leveraged when necessary.
  - Grants are available for joint activities with regional or international entities, formalized through cooperation agreements.
  - Ineligible activities: Construction of buildings, rent payments, and utilities.
  - Project duration: 2–3 years.

## Expression of Interest (EOI) Submission

- Applicants must submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) when applying for the MKCF.
- The EOI must include all required components and submit them in PDF format only and budget template in excel format.
- For preparing the Eoi, please refer to the **MKCF Management Manual** which provides comprehensive guidelines on project application processes, financial management, procurement, monitoring, and reporting requirements for project proponents and implementing agencies.

- Submission deadlines:
  - For government agencies, NGOs, and academic institutions from Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Vietnam and Thailand please submit EOs to the Focal Point at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) in Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Vietnam and Thailand **by April 10, 2026**. The country focal point is mentioned below.
  - For international organizations (including UN agencies and international NGOs): Submit EOs to the ROK MOFA **by April 10, 2026**. The MoFA RoK focal point is mentioned below.
- **AI-generated Eols will be rejected; we encourage the use of human effort in developing Eols and Project Proposals.**
- **Only shortlisted Eols will be contacted** for the next phase of the application process to submit the **Full Project Proposal**.
